### **Objective of RFI**

The Minnesota Department of Agriculture (MDA) is looking for public input on a **draft** application for the Minnesota Local Food Purchase Assistance (LFPA) Program. Feedback shared during this process will inform the final application process for this competitive grant program, which is expected to be released in winter 2023.

# **Background and overview**

The goal of the LFPA program is to purchase local food from socially disadvantaged farmers and distribute this food to underserved communities throughout the state. The draft application outlines the proposed requirements and application process for this program and funding. Feedback is welcome from potential applicants to the program along with others interested in community food systems, including farmers, food hubs, economic development agencies, and hunger relief networks.

Minnesota's \$3.82 million LFPA funds are available as part of a cooperative agreement program that the MDA has signed with the U.S. Department of Agriculture Agricultural Marketing Service. The LFPA program is authorized by the American Rescue Plan to maintain and improve food and agricultural supply chain resiliency.

## Information requested

Stakeholders are asked to review the Minnesota LFPA draft application and provided feedback via a Microsoft Form or through participation in one of four virtual input sessions. The survey includes 13 questions and is estimated to take 10 -15 minutes to complete, depending on the amount of feedback you choose to provide. It includes questions asking respondents to identify what they like and don't like about the draft application, opportunities to share feedback in response to specific questions MDA staff have included on the draft application, and demographic questions. All questions are optional.

  - But if a Responder submits information that it believes to be trade secret/confidential materials, at the time the response is submitted the Responder must clearly mark every page of trade secret materials in its response with the words "Trade Secret" or "Confidential," and must justify the trade secret designation for each item in its Response (be specific, do not make general statements of confidentiality. Include reference to specific facts, licenses, trademarks, etc., and any relevant statutes or other law, such as how the data meets the requirements of MINN. STAT. 13.37, subd. 1(b)). Any decision by the State to disclose information designated by the Responder as trade secret/confidential will be made consistent with the Minnesota Government Data Practices Act, Ch. 13, and other relevant laws and regulations.
