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Annual Produce Farm Inventory Report





Greetings MN produce growers!

We'd like to extend a thank you to everyone who participated in the 2019 Grower Questionnaire distributed by the Minnesota Department of Agriculture's (MDA) Produce Safety Program. In total, we received 599 responses from farmers across the state who shared information about their farm activities, crops, markets and average sales. Everyone who responded received an official letter from the MDA identifying their farm's status under the Produce Safety Rule (PSR) and what, if any, requirements of the rule applied to their farm business for the 2019 calendar year.

Thanks to your support, we are well on our way to building a comprehensive produce farm inventory that will help us understand what produce is being grown, where it is sold, and who is involved. The more we can understand about produce farming in Minnesota, the better we are able to support farms in adopting produce safety practices and working with partners to explore additional resources like market development, production support and education.

Our Grower Questionnaire is the main tool we use to help us build the produce farm inventory, identify farms' statuses under the PSR and work to support all produce farms in Minnesota with resources and education on produce safety. This annual report shares findings from our current inventory. As we launch our 2020 Grower Questionnaire, we hope you take the time to respond and help us build a produce farm inventory for Minnesota. We look forward to your responses and hope you find value in learning more about our program and what we know about the produce industry in Minnesota.

Outreach And Education Activities

The Produce Safety Program works closely with the University of Minnesota Extension to co-host trainings and provide education and resources to farmers across the state in order to help them understand the requirements of the PSR and ways to implement produce safety on farms.

- 23 Food Safety Modernization Act Produce Safety Rule Grower Trainings have been hosted in Minnesota since 2017.
- 273 individual farms from Minnesota have attended.
- 2 Spanish language FSMA Produce Safety Rule Grower Trainings were hosted to serve both Latino farmers and H-2A produce farm employees.
- Training teams consist of 1-2 farmer educators in addition to UMN and MDA staff. Farmer trainers provide a wealth of knowledge by sharing their on-farm experience implementing produce safety.
- 11 FSMA Produce Safety Rule Grower Trainings are planned for 2019-2020.

University Of MN Extension Resource Development

UMN Extension partners have developed many educational resources for farmers about how to implement produce safety on farms. Highlights from this work include:

- 9 new factsheets about Produce Safety and Good Agricultural Practices have been developed on topics including GAP audits, Farm status under the PSR, and Water testing protocols for farms.

Most Commonly Crown Produce Crops That Aren't Covered By The PSR





Unique stats from the Produce Farm Inventory

- 50% of farms in the inventory are registered MN Grown Members
- 13% of farms in the inventory are certified organic
- 44 food coops across the state are buying produce from MN growers
- Over 250 farmers markets throughout the state support local produce farms
- 141 different produce commodities are grown around the state
- The average number of commodities per farm is 10.3
- 1 farm reported growing 77 unique produce commodities and 42 farms reported growing over 50 different produce commodities
- Currently we've identified 1,806 produce farms in Minnesota which is about 3% of the state's total farms.
