1. Population: 5.7 million – ranks 22<sup>nd</sup> in the U.S. (Rural: 22%; Urban: 78%)

2. Total Area: 84,397 square miles – ranks 12<sup>th</sup> in the U.S.

**3. Farm Land:** 25.4 million acres (50% of total land area)

**4. Farm number:** 67,100 farms **Organic**: 650 farms (#10 in the U.S.)/163,835 acres (#11 in the U.S.)

5. Average Farm Size: 379 acres

Minnesota's agricultural industries contribute over 15% of Minnesota's total economic activities and support over 10% of all jobs.
