### Details

- Nonrefundable state tax credit for sellers and and lords who sell/rent to MN beginning farmers
- **Funding is limited**, and credits are approved first-come, first-served regardless of due dates.
- Beginning farmer (BF) must be an individual (notbusiness entity), MN resident who has enteredinto farming in the last 10 years. BF must have anet worth under \$1,013,000.
- BF must be enrolled in or have completed anapproved financial business managementprogram (FBM)

  - » BF's are eligible for a tax credit equal totheir FBM tuition paid up to \$1,500annually for three years.

### \*Land Sale Updates

- Credits for farmland sales will be 8% of the saleprice for all beginning farmer buyers and 12% if thebuyer is also an emerging farmer.
- Emerging Farmers include farmers or aspiringfarmers who are women, veterans, persons withdisabilities, American Indian or Alaskan Natives, members of a community of color, young (35 andyounger), LGBTQIA+, urban(reside or farm in cities with a population over5,000), and any other emerging farmers asdetermined by the commissioner.
- Parents, grandparents, and siblings are now eligible for the tax credit if they sell farmland to a direct family member. This does not apply to rentals orother types of sales.ww
