Pesticide Application Information Worker Protection Standard (WPS) Requirements

1. Posting Information

- Agricultural employers must post pesticide application information where workers and pesticide handlers often gather. The information should be visible and easy to read.
- The owner must post and maintain all pesticide application records at the establishment, including those made by commercial applicators.

2. Display Timing

- Post the pesticide application and hazard information within 24 hours after the application ends, but before workers enter the treated area.
- Include copies of the Safety Data Sheet (SDS) for each pesticide product used.

3. Display Duration

- Keep the information posted from the start of the display period until at least 30 days after the last Restricted Entry Interval (REI) ends, or until workers or handlers are no longer on the site, whichever comes first.
- Ag Workers must not enter areas where pesticides have been applied until:
 1. The pesticide application and hazard information for each product used in that area is posted.
 2. The REI has expired and all EPA-approved warning signs have been removed or covered.

4. Access to Information

- Ag Workers and Pesticide Handlers must have access to the posted information contained in this form at all times during normal working hours.

5. Retention of Information

- The pesticide application and hazard information must be retained for two years after the date of expiration of the REI for the pesticide applied.
