



## How to Use the Marketing Log:

The goal of this document is to prompt producers to review the treatment records and health history for animals that are going to market. This helps assure healthy unadulterated animals enter into the food chain.

Column Name	Document the following information:
Date	Record the date the animal is sent to market
Animal ID	Record the animal's identification
Treated within past 90 days?	Check YES if the animal was treated within the past 90 days and NO if it was not
Last drug used	Record the last drug that was administered to the animal
Any S.T.O.P. criteria present?	S: Standing or walking is not possible T: Treatments were recent and may require an extended withdrawal period O: Obvious condition/disease that would lead to condemnation of the carcass P: Poor prognosis or poor body condition score (two or less) for recently treated animals
Date latest withdrawal period expired	Refer to treatment records to make sure the animal has cleared ALL withdrawal periods and record the most recent withdrawal period expiration date
O.K. To Sell?	The animal is O.K. to sell if: <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• It has cleared the withdrawal period</li><li>• Appears to be in good health</li><li>• Does NOT exhibit any of the S.T.O.P. criteria listed above*</li></ul>

**\*If your animal meets any of the S.T.O.P. criteria listed above, consider getting additional veterinary input to determine whether the animal is fit for slaughter or if the withdrawal period should be extended.**
