Minnesota Rule 1505.3110 INSPECTION AND MAINTENANCE requires that maintenance of bulk pesticide storage facilities must be performed as necessary in order to ensure that the integrity of the bulk pesticide containers, secondary containment areas, and loading areas are maintained and to minimize the risk of leakage. It is recommended that records be kept for at least 5 years. Inspection records must contain the name of the person making the inspection, the date of each inspection, conditions noted, and maintenance performed. Inspection schedules are as follows:

Weekly Inspections

- Bulk pesticide containers and plumbing

Monthly Inspections

- Secondary containment areas (base, seams, and walls) at least monthly while bulk pesticide is in storage
- Loading area pads
