

# Does My Tree Have Emerald Ash Borer (EAB)?



#### **STEP 4**

## Does my ash tree have symptoms of EAB?

IF YES, GO TO STEP #5

IF NO, GO TO STEP #6



Woodpecker Holes Woodpeckers like EAB larvae and woodpecker holes may indicate the presence of EAB.



**Bark Cracks** EAB larvae tunneling beneath the bark can cause the bark to split open, revealing the larval galleries beneath.



**S-Shaped Galleries** The distinct S-shaped galleries under the bark are diagnostic of EAB.

### It could be EAB.
